## **UNEMPLOYMENT**

In Siouxland

Based on 2023 data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Woodbury County, IA, exhibited a 2.8% unemployment rate, reflecting a 0.4% decrease from the 2022 data. Dakota County, NE, reported a slightly lower unemployment rate at 2.7%, with a 0.2% decrease from the previous year. Union County, SD, had the lowest unemployment rate among the three counties, boasting a 1.7% unemployment rate—0.7% decrease from 2022.

In terms of poverty rates, Woodbury County faced the highest prevalence at 15.5%, surpassing the state average by over 4%. In contrast, Dakota County reported a 10.4% poverty rate, while Union County had the lowest rate at 6.5%—just over half of the state average of 12.3%.

There are multiple areas of opportunity in Siouxland to address employment barriers. Investing in accessible education programs aimed at developing relevant skills can equip individuals for available job opportunities. Implementing anti-discrimination policies will ensure fair opportunities for everyone. Enhancing transportation and community development in underserved areas will reduce geographic barriers to employment. Mentorship programs and vocational training can help those with limited work experience. Affordable childcare and mental health support will enable more people to participate in the workforce.
